Clarehouse is the first of its kind in Oklahoma; a social model hospice proving a loving home and care for dying people in need. Kelley co-founded this project and has overseen all aspects of its start-up and development. Nationally, she provides consulting and mentoring to aspiring social model hospices and serves as the president of the Omega Home Network. She created Outcome Pathways for end-of-life care and education.
